DISCLOSURES

- This institution does not employ campus security personnel. We encourage employees and students to report suspected criminal activity/emergencies to the nearest available intuitional officer. In the event of an emergency directly contact local law enforcement or other emergency response agencies by dialing 911.
- All students and employees are required to report any crime or emergency to the nearest institutional officer. In the event an employee or student wishes to report a crime on a voluntary or confidential basis, the institutional office will be prepared to record and report the crime, but not the name of the informant. The student or employee may, in order to maintain confidentiality, submit the information in writing to their institution officer without signature. If the student wished to maintain confidentiality, the student will contact their teacher or school official who in turn will contact the nearest supervisor to report criminal actions or emer4gicnes to the appropriate agency by calling 911.
- Preparation of the annual disclosure crime statistics report is obtained by the institutions director who contacts the correct police department for statistics
- Only students, employees and other parties having business with this institution should be on institutional property. Staff, faculty, students and prospective students or any person entering the premises must have and display at all times an identification badge. Those without an identification badge must sign in the office entrance and identify their purpose of the visit, and the person to be visited and must register their time in and out of the building. The visitor must also wear a visitors badge while on campus. All rear access doors leading to the campus are closed and locked during evening hours starting at 5:00 pm. When the school. When the school closed for the night the school official, or supervisor will inspect each room to see that it is empty and then set the alarms. Other individuals present on institutional property and any time without the express person's ion of the appropriate office shall be viewed as trespassing and may as such be subject to a fine or arrest. In addition student and employees present on institutional property during periods of non-operation without the express permission of the appropriate school official may also be viewed as trespassing and may also be subject to fine or arrest.
- Current policies concerning campus law enforcement are as follows:
 - 1. Institution's official have no powers of arrest other tan the citizen arrest law are required in the event of a crime or emergency to call the correct agency dial911 for the police and emergency services. The citizen's arrest law will be invoked on as a last resort, and after all other possibilities have been explored.
 - 2. Employees should contact their immediate or nearest ranging supervisor to report any criminal action or emergency to the appropriate agency by calling 911. If possible, the institutional official shall attempt to non-violent deal with the crime or emergency with the appropriate agency on campus. Individual discretion must be used as undue risk should not be taken.
 - 3. The institution currently has no procedure for encouraging or facilitating pastoral or professional counseling mental health or otherwise other than the student or employee is encouraged to seek such aid.
- Our institution does not offer regularly scheduled crime awareness or prevention programs, student are encouraged to exercise proper care in seeing to their own personal safety and the safety of others. The following is a description of policies, rules and programs designed to inform students and employees about the prevention of crimes on campus.
 - 1. Do not leave personal property in classroom
 - 2. Report to your institutional official any suspicious personal
 - 3. Always to walk in groups outside the schools premises
 - 4. If you are waiting for a ride stay within sight of other people

- 5. Employees will close and lock all doors windows and blinds and turn off lights when leaving the room.
- 6. The crime awareness and campus security act is available upon request to students employees and prospective students
- 7. The school has no formal program other then orientation that disseminates this information. All information is available upon request
- 8. Information regarding any crimes committed on the campus or campus properties will be available and posted within 5 business days after the reporting of the crime and be avail be for 60 business days during normal business hours unless the disclose is prohibited by law, would jeopardized the confidentiality of the victim or an ongoing criminal investigation the safety of an individual's, cause a suspect to flee evade detection or result in the destruction of evidence. Once the reason for the lock of disclosure is no longer in force, the institution must disclose the information. If there is a request for information that is older than 60 days the information must be made available within 2 business days of the request.
- The institution does not offer regularly scheduled crime awareness or prevention programs other than orientation where all the institutions policies and regulations are properly disclosed to prospective students.
- All incidents will be reported on recorded in an incident report located at each campus. This report includes the date, time, location incident reported, disposition of the incident and the person who the report will be completed within 24 hours of the incident.
- This institution does not permit the sale possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages on school property and adheres to and enforces all state underage drinking laws
- The institution does not permit the possession use or sale of illegal drugs by its employees and students and adherers to and enforces all state federal drug laws. The violations of these policies by students or employees may result in expulsion termination and or arrest.
- Information concerning drug and alcohol abuse education programs are posted at campus and is distributed annually to students and staff

Sexual assaults (criminal offenses) on campus will be reported immediately to the intuitions official who will report it to 911 emergency and police units. The person who was victimized will be encouraged to seek counseling a rape cries center and to maintain all physical evidence until such a time as that person can be properly transported to a hospital or rape cries center for proper treatment. The institution has zero tolerance of such assaults. The violation of this policy by student or employees may result in expulsion while investigations are being followed, termination and or arrest.

VAWA _ Violence Against Women Act

On March 7, 2013, President Obama signed the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013, which amended the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act). The Statute requires institutions to include this new information in the Annual Security Report as of October 1, 2014. Until final regulations are published and effective, institutions must make a good-faith effort to comply with the statutory provisions as written. Institutions should use the statute as the basis for revising or developing policies, procedures and programs in advance of the ASR that must be issued by October 1, 2014.

The VAWA amended the Clery Act to require institutions to compile statistics for incidents of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking and to include certain policies, procedures and programs pertaining to these incidents in their annual security reports.

The statute requires institutions to specify in their ASRs the procedures that they will follow once an incident of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault or stalking has been reported, including a statement of

the standard of evidence that will be used during any institutional conduct proceeding arising from such a report. The statute requires institutions to include in their ASRs expanded information about a victim's options for and available assistance in, changing academic, living, transportation, and working situations if requested and reasonably available, regardless of whether the victim chooses to report the crime to campus security or local law enforcement.

There will be new crime categories of domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking in accordance with the Violence Against Women Act of 1994 as follows:

- A. Domestic Violence is a "felony or misdemeanor crime of violence committed by
 - A current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim.
 - A person with whom the victim shares a child in common
 - A person who is cohabitating with or has cohabitated with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner.
 - A person similarly situated to as a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies (under VAWA), or
 - Any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction."
- B. Dating Violence means "violence committed by a person -
 - Who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim; and
 - Where the existence of such a relationship shall be determined based on a consideration of the following factors:
 - a. Length of the relationship
 - b. Type of relationship and
 - c. Frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship."
- C. Stalking means "engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to
 - Fears for his or her safety or the safety of others; or
 - Suffer substantial emotional distress."

Institutions must make a good-faith effort to include these statistics for these crimes.
